Through interactive discussions and activities, they discovered that speaking out is not as daunting as it seems—but an empowering experience that unlocks new possibilities. One of the highlights was witnessing students step out of their comfort zones to present their ideas and reflections. By the end of the session, their confidence had visibly grown and they left with a greater sense of self-belief and the ability to communicate effectively in a range of situations. This impactful day was made possible thanks to the generous support of the Jack Petchey Foundation. The Foundation, created by Sir Jack Petchey CBE, has invested over £143 million to inspire and support young people aged 11-25 across London and Essex.
